Established in 1972, Kamla Nehru Institute of Physical and Social Sciences, Sultanpur is one of the oldest affiliated institutions of Dr. Ram Manohar Lohiya. Avadh University Ayodhya. During the forty-seven years of its existence, the institute has established itself as one of the premier affiliated colleges of the University for the Study of Arts, Science, Commerce, Law, Education and other related areas of interdisciplinary studies.

To begin with, the Institute was founded by the great visionary Sri K. N. From July 1973 till the Institute separated as Kamla Nehru Institute of Physical and Social Sciences in April 1985, it functioned as Kamla Nehru Institute of Science and Technology. Following the separation, the suffix "Science and Technology" was dropped from the name of the Institute and it became Kamla Nehru Institute of Physical and Social Sciences (KNIPSS). Since the Institute provides legacy of students' discipline and regular class teaching, students from neighboring districts prefer to take admission in spite of the availability of several colleges in their localities.
