Following the separation, the suffix "Science and Technology" was dropped from the name of the Institute and it became Kamla Nehru Institute of Physical and Social Sciences (KNIPSS). Since the Institute provides legacy of students' discipline and regular class teaching, students from neighboring districts prefer to take admission in spite of the availability of several colleges in their localities.
